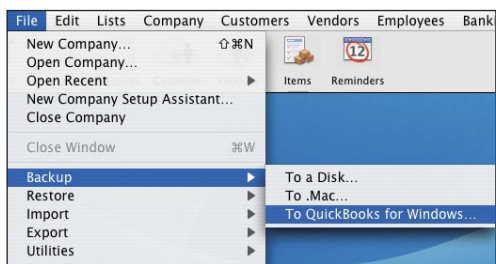
Give these instructions to your accountant.

It's easy to share data between QuickBooks for Mac and QuickBooks for Windows¹. Here's how to do it:

Mac > Windows

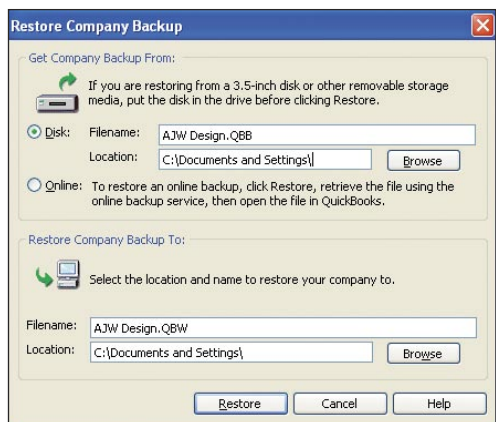
- 1 In QuickBooks: Pro 2005 for Mac, choose **File > Backup > To QuickBooks for Windows**.

- Name the file.
- A copy of the Mac file is now formatted for Windows and saved as a .QBB file.



Note: For Pro 6.0 for Mac, choose **File > Create a file for QuickBooks Windows**.

- 2 Send the file to your accountant via email, CD-ROM, USB drive, Zip disk, or Flash drive (most Macs read and write data to and from PC-formatted media).
- 3 In QuickBooks for Windows, choose **File > Restore**.
 - Browse your computer until you find the company backup file (.QBB).
 - Select the file and click **"Restore"**.
 - Your accountant can now review and edit your file.



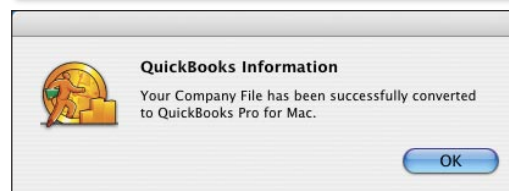
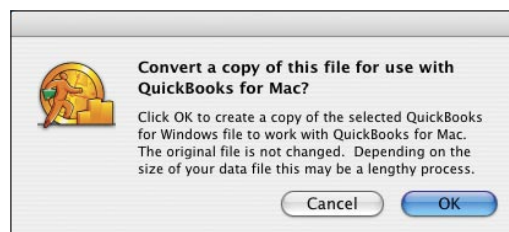
It's easy to share data between QuickBooks for Mac and QuickBooks for Windows¹. Here's how to do it:

Windows > Mac

- 1 In QuickBooks for Windows, save the file as.QBW or a .QBB backup file, NOT as an Accountant Transfer File (.QBX).

Note: If your client is using Pro 6.0 for Mac, you must save as a .QBW file because Pro 6.0 for Mac does not open .QBB backup files.

- 2 Send the file to your client via email, CD-ROM, USB drive, Zip disk, or Flash drive (most Macs read and write data to and from PC-formatted media).
- 3 In QuickBooks: Pro 2005 for Mac, your client opens the file by choosing **File > Open Company**.
