

HOW TO PRONOUNCE WORDS HAVING SILENT WORDS

SILENT WORDS put us in very darkest situation, are they? Well, let me tell you first, I'm not from those who are sat on 1st row of classroom or from whom English are used as secondary mother tongue language. In fact till joining any professional course I am not ever bothered about importance of English as misunderstood that it can be compensated with others strengths. But after so many failures both in professional as well as personal life, one of my senior colleagues advised me "please concentrate over English also as core subject".

In this post I will explain you some convinced rules of pronunciation of words having silent letter(s) with words used in daily life but due to lack basic knowledge we not able to synchronize the same rules with other words comes us occasionally. Let me try to elaborate some rules:-

K - **K**NOW, **K**NEE, **K**NIFE, **K**NIT, **K**NUCKLE

As you can see whenever "**K**" comes before "**N**", "**K**" always gets silent

P - **P**SYCHOLOGY, **P**SYCHIATRIST

As you can see whenever "**P**" comes before "**S**", "**P**" always gets silent

W - **W**RAP, **W**RINKLE, **W**RATH, **W**RITE, **W**RIST

As you can see whenever "**W**" comes before "**R**", "**W**" always gets silent

L - SHOUL**D**, COUL**D**, WOUL**D**

As you can see whenever "**L**" comes between "**U**" and "**D**", "**L**" always gets silent

S - IS**L**E, AIS**L**E, IS**L**AND

As you can see whenever "**S**" comes between "**I**" and "**L**", "**S**" always gets silent

B - DE**B**T, DOUB**B**T

As you can see whenever "**B**" comes before "**T**", "**B**" always gets silent

T - LIS**T**EN SOF**T**EN, CAST**L**E, OF**T**EN

I can't define any standard rule why "**T**" get silent, just I can say read and learn

G - MI**G**HT, RI**G**HT, WEI**G**HT, FI**G**HT

As you can see whenever "**G**" comes between "**I**" and "**H**", "**G**" always gets silent
