Overview of Chartered Accountancy Course

The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India periodically reviews the scheme of Education and Training to remain in tandem with developments in the field of education and other changes at national and global level. Evolving business also demands newer skills from the accounting professionals. Accordingly, the existing scheme was revamped and the new scheme was launched on 10th December, 2008.

Different levels of Chartered Accountancy Course

1.	Entry Level Test	Common Proficiency Test
2.	First Stage of Theoretical Education	Integrated Professional Competence Course
3.	Final Stage of Theoretical Education	Final Course

The Entry level test is named as Common Proficiency Test (CPT) which is designed in the pattern of entry level test for engineering, medical and other professional courses. It is a test of 4 hours duration comprising of two sessions of 2 hours each, with a break between two sessions. The test comprises of objective type questions only with negative marking for choosing wrong options. The Common Proficiency Test (CPT) has replaced Professional Education (Course-I) effective from September 13, 2006. The last Professional Education (Examination – I) was held in November, 2007.

Under the present scheme the period of articulated training is three years. Students before joining for articulated training are required to complete Orientation Programme and Information Technology Training (ITT).

Orientation Programme is of one week's period which covers following topics: Personality Development, Communication Skills, Office Procedures, Business Environment, General Commercial Knowledge, etc. Students are also required to complete an updated version of the ITT programme relevant for the professional practice and training. Components focused on application software relevant for accounting and auditing in addition, knowledge of Electronic Spread Sheet, Data base Management System, Web-technology and System Security and Maintenance.

The Integrated Professional Competence Course (IPCC) has replaced the Professional Competence Course (PCC) effective from December 10, 2008. The last PCC examination will be held in November, 2012.

The last leg of the Chartered Accountancy is Final Course, designed to impart expert knowledge in financial reporting, auditing and professional ethics, taxation, corporate laws, system control, strategic finance and advanced management accountancy. The Final (New) Course was launched in February 2007 and first examination under new scheme was held in November, 2008.

In order to strengthen the Management and Communication Skills of the CA Student, the Institute organises 15 days General Management and Communication Skills (GMCS) Course and made compulsory to undergo before becoming a member of the Institute. In order to remain focussed with the requirements, the Institute has proposed to have the GMCS Course to be undergone twice – during the first year of articulated training and during the third year of articulated training – for a period of 15 days each.

Apart from the above, the Institute also organises four weeks residential programme on 'Professional Development Skills' for students and members on optional basis.

Updated syllabus is benchmarked to chartered accountancy courses available around the globe and is fully compliant to International Education Standards issued by the International Federation of Accountants.

The Placement Programmes for Newly Qualified Chartered Accountants will be held during August-September, 2012 throughout the country at 18 Centres viz: Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Baroda, Bhubaneswar, Chandigarh, Chennai , Coimbatore, Ernakulam, Hyderabad, Indore, Jaipur, Kanpur, Kolkata, Mumbai , Nagpur, New Delhi, Pune and Vapi.

Step1:

- Click on Campus Interview and fill up the Form Proforma and Payment to get centre wise Day Slots based on norms of Priority and availability.

Step 2:

After the allotment of day slots, the organization is required to remit the participation fees accordingly.

Step 3:

On the completion of online registration and the receipt of the participation fees, the CMII Secretariat would provide the online access to the database of the candidates for shortlisting.

Step4:

The entity is required to do the online shortlisting of the candidates within the specified time frame for the respective centres as per the schedule of placement programme.

It is the total cost that an Organisation is spending towards their employees which includes Salary details like Basic salary, House Rent Allowance, Company Leased Accommodation, Daily Allowance, City Compensatory Allowance, Special Allowance, Conveyance Allowance, Lunch Allowance, Entertainment Allowance, Books/Periodicals Allowance, Education Allowance, House Maintenance Allowance, Furnishing Allowance, Dress/Uniform Allowance, Other allowances; Benefits/Perks/Reimbursements like Value of company car, Car subsidy (or equivalent tax savings), Driver's salary, Maintenance and Petrol Expenses, Leave Travel Allowance, Canteen Subsidy, Telephone Expenses, Mobile Phone, Club Membership, Electricity/Gas, Servant/Gardener, Credit Cards, Furnishings/Durables, Holiday facilities, Medical reimbursements, Medical insurance, Personal Accident Scheme, other benefits; Retirals like Provident fund, Superannuation fund, Gratuity; Bonus like Fixed Bonus, Productivity linked Variable Bonus, Any other performance oriented incentive including Stock Option Plan and; Soft Loans like Interest subsidy, etc.

It shall be made automated and data will be taken directly from proforma filled in by companies so as to make this process standardized.
